DO NOT DRIVE ON PROPERTY-NOT DESIGNATED FOR OFF-ROADING.

ONLY ALLOWED TO RIDE ON DESIGNATED AREAS

OBEY ALL TRAFFIC LAWS REDUCE SOUND BY AVOIDING

RAPID ACCELERATION
AVOID PLAYING LOUD MUSIC
BE AWARE OF YOUR ROUTE
DO NOT DRIVE FROM THE TRAIL AFTER
10:00 PM

DRIVING OHV'S ON CONCRETE CREATES A SOUND THAT EMANATES ACROSS THE COMMUNITIES.

SIGNAL WITH ONE HAND THE CORRESPONDING AMOUNT OF FINGERS FOR THE AMOUNT OF RIDERS WITH YOUR GROUP

WHILE RIDING ON A DESIGNATED ROUTES AND PASSING OTHER ONCOMING TRAIL USERS. THE LAST ONE SHOULD SHOW HIS CLOSED FIST SAYING NO MORE.

USE A DOT APPROVED HELMETS AND SEAT BELTS

IT'S THE MOST IMPORTANT PIECE OF SAFETY EQUIPMENT. UTAH LAW REQUIRES ANYONE UNDER 18 YRS OLD TO WEAR A HELMET ON AN OHV.

DO NOT PARK YOUR HOT OHV IN DRY GRASS

OR ANY KIND OF VEGETATION TO AVOID A FIRE.

DO NOT IMPACT THE TRAIL LEAVE IT AS YOU FOUND IT

RECENTLY SOME UNKNOWN OFF-ROADER DECIDED AN OBSTACLE WAS TOO DIFFICULT FOR THEM, SO USED CONCRETE TO FILL THE OBSTACLE. THERE IS A LARGE PENALTY FOR THIS AND GOOD AMMUNITION TO PROVE WHY WE SHOULDN'T HAVE THIS PRIVILEGE ANYMORE.
